<p>To be admitted to the ELI, students must have completed at least three years of English language study in their home countries and must be at least 17 years of age and a high school graduate.</p> <p>Applications and required documents should be received by the ELI office sixty (60) days before the start of the term.</p> <p>The following need to be included:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> •the completed application form •evidence of financial support (original bank statement, sponsor's letter, scholarship award letter, etc.) •a \$50.00 non-refundable application fee •students requesting residence hall accommodations must include an additional \$250.00 deposit 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> •copy of valid passport information page •copy of high school diploma <p>If you are accepted for admission, your I-20 (Certificate of Eligibility) will be sent to you by <u>express mail</u>.</p> <p>Payment of tuition must be made thirty days before the start of the term, unless special arrangements are made with the director.</p> <p>ELI/EWU accepts Visa and Master Card payments for all fees and tuition. Silver Eagle Meal Plan: Provides enough “dining points” to buy approximately 10-12 meals per week. This plan works well for light eaters or students who eat elsewhere for many of their meals.
